George went to Heaven to be with his Lord on Thursday, July 20, 2017, at The Brook in Gladwin, MI. Age 87 years. George was born on December 9, 1929, in Detroit, MI, the fourth of five children of the late Rev. George M. Krach, Sr. and Elsie (Koch) Krach. He married Carol E. Losch on June 8, 1957. She predeceased him on August 29, 2015. George retired from Holy Cross Lutheran School in 1993 after 40 years as a teacher, athletic director, coach, and principal. Surviving are two sons and their spouses, Rev. James (Jennifer) Krach of Gladwin, and David (Sue) Krach, of Texas; six grandchildren, Joshua, Justin, Abby, Alex, Desiree and Ellie; a great-granddaughter, Jaedyn; a daughter-in-law, Cara Allen, of Ohio; one sister, Irma (Merton) Grabau; several nieces and nephews; and dear friends in Saginaw, Cadillac, and Gladwin. He was also predeceased by his son, Gary, one brother, Rev. Harold Krach, and two sisters, Dorothy Schmidt and Luella Schoof.

Funeral and committal services to celebrate the life of George M. Krach, Jr. will be held 11:00 a.m., Tuesday, July 25, 2017, at Holy Cross Lutheran Church, 600 Court St., Saginaw. The Rev.
