Arnie passed away peacefully Friday morning, November 24, 2017, at Covenant – Cooper surrounded by his family. Age 91 years. Arnie was born on September 19, 1926, in Frankenmuth, Michigan to the late Alfred and Katherine (Schwab) Grueber. He had served in the U.S. Army during WWII. Arnie was married to Bonnie Hutfilz on May 27, 1950, in Saginaw. She survives him. Prior to his retirement, Arnie was employed as a Heavy Equipment Operator at Hutfilz Trucking. He was a member of the American Legion Post 439, the International Union of Operating Engineers Local #324, Teamsters Local #406, the F.O.E. #4413, and Bethlehem Lutheran Church, where he had served on various boards, including as sexton of Bethlehem Lutheran Cemetery for 25 years.

Surviving besides his wife Bonnie, are their children, Pam Grueber, Kim Grueber and Tim Grueber; two grandchildren, Adam (Chelsea) Grueber, Kaitlynn (Ryan) Sills; one great-grandchild, Greyson Grueber; several nieces, nephews, extended family, including Cathy Grueber, dear friends and special caregivers, Jeanne and Ellen. He was also predeceased by his brothers, sisters and their spouses, Armin and Lillian Grueber, Roy and Arlene Grueber, Edna and Howard Meyerhuber, and Eleanora and Norman Dietzel.
