She was then married to Elmer E. Hoeppe on February 17, 1966, in Saginaw, where he predeceased her on June 18, 1994. She was an active member at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, where she served in various groups as a Sunday School Teacher, in Evangelism, Stephen Ministries, Bible Classes, Ladies Blest, Senior Stars, and called on Shut-Ins. She also was a Log Monitor for the Lutheran Hour for 25 years, under Dr. Oswald Hoffman; Stephen Ministry at St. Luke's Hospital for 7 years, under Pastor Dice. She loved to travel, having been to Hawaii, England, Germany, Switzerland, France, and her favorite trip of all time was to the Holy Land in 1999. She was an avid Detroit Tigers Fan, who enjoyed her trips to the ball park. When not in attendance, she would keep her own box-scores at home. The Celebration of Carol's Life will now be held 12:00 noon on Saturday, September 19, 2020, at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, 808 Weiss, Saginaw, MI.
