A former resident of Frankenmuth, Michigan and Orange City, Florida, Whitey Newbold passed away at his home on Monday, November 22, 2021, after a courageous battle with cancer. He was 87 years old. Whitey was born on June 5, 1934, in Frankenmuth Twp., to the late Morse A. and Lillian A. (Bartell) Newbold. He was inducted into the United States Army on January 12, 1956, then he was honorably discharged on January 4, 1958. Prior to his retirement as a supervisor in 1999, Whitey was employed at Saginaw Steering Gear Plant for General Motors. Following his retirement, He moved to Orange City, FL, where he became a master gardener, nurtured many plants, flowers and helped all his neighbors. Whitey leaves many friends in Florida.

Whitey was first married to Helen (Skimson) Newbold on May 24, 1958, and she predeceased him on March 4, 2005. He then married Margaret (Cano) Keinath on June 8, 2007, and she survives him.
