Town COC. She loved serving others and her family. She was a hospice volunteer through A&D Homecare and Hospice. She loved bringing comfort and joy to her patients. They meant a lot to her. Janet loved spending time with her family and friends. She was a talented baker, enjoyed traveling with her family, and doing water aerobics at the Y.M.C.A. with her friends. She enjoyed gardening, growing plants, and was an avid crafter. She was a competitive Euchre player with her sister-in-law, Margo Hessler and cornhole player with her husband. She was always up for any element of fun. She will be sadly missed by her family and friends. When she got diagnosed with cancer, she'd often like to say, "Having stage IV lung cancer is better than getting hit by a bus". Meaning she was glad to have more time with the people that she loved. Sadly that time has come to an end. In accordance with Janet's wishes, cremation has taken place.
