Levi Acoff Sr. passed away at the age of 88, on Monday December 4, 2023. He was born February 17, 1935, to the late Mr. and Mrs. Jessie and Della Lee Acoff in Greenville, Mississippi. Some of his talents included sketching, drawing and being undefeated playing checkers. He also enjoyed cooking and doing household remodeling projects in his home. Levi always made his family laugh by singing his signature songs! These songs have been sang to 3 generations! We all will miss his charisma and humor.
