



Mona J. Gottschalk

December 3, 1933 - December 26, 2016

On December 26, 2016, our mother, grandmother and great-grandmother went to her waiting Savior's arms from Covenant Medical Center-Cooper, following a short illness. Her family hopes He wasn't late to her arrival because she hated it when anyone was late. Our mother's life was ruled by three things: her church, her tireless work ethic and her family.

Her church: She loved Holy Cross Lutheran Church, Pastor Krueger, and never turned them down. She loved her Altar duty, helping with funeral luncheons, and visiting hospitalized members of the congregation.

Her work ethic: Last year was the first that she did not mow her own lawn and remove her own snow. No one could do it quite the way she wanted it done. She worked for Drs. Don, Jim, and Andrea Mertz for over 40 years, whom she considered family. She took only four sick days in that time, making it hard to match her loyalty to her employers. When she picked blue berries, Drs. Mertz got to have them before we did. When we were growing up, trying to take a day off of school or work was met with disdain for even thinking of shirking our responsibilities. But we still had to try. When we asked her to call the school or our employer to notify them of our sickness, the next sentence out of our mother's mouth would include the word, "tough" and she would loudly spell it for you and never spell it the same way twice, which of course made it even more fun to try.

Her family: Until a few years ago, she would have our families over and make a huge chicken dinner with all the goodies. No one could make her baked beans, German potato salad or sweet potatoes like she could. She loved her family and was there for us in good times and bad. She never judged, ever! She was not perfect, as none of us are. But she was a great example of a life well lived. She is now where she wanted to be – with our dad, and all the others that went before her, Willard, Wayne, Joyce, George, Lorraine and Lois.

She had just celebrated her 83rd birthday. Mona was born on December 3, 1933, in Saginaw, to the late George and Lorraine (Newman) Schwalm. She was married to John A. Gottschalk on January 16, 1954. After 56 years of marriage, John predeceased her on September 14, 2010.

Surviving are one son, one daughter and their spouses, John C. (Connie J.) Gottschalk, and Kathryn (Paul) Mason; five grandchildren, Chris (Jourdan), Matt (Jamie), Anna (Don), Johnny, and Kayla (Dwayne); one great-granddaughter, Trystyn; a special nephew that was more like her brother, Willard (Shirley) Schwalm; her nieces Carol (Richard) Mallory, and Ellen, all of whom included Mona in their lives; and her special friends, Bonnie, Harold, Elsie and Verna.

Memorial service will take place 11:00 a.m. Saturday, December 31, 2016, at Holy Cross Lutheran Church, 600 Court St. The Rev. James F. Krueger will officiate. Private burial will follow at a later date in Holy Cross Lutheran Cemetery. Friends are welcome to visit with the family at the church on Saturday from 10:00 a.m. until the time of service.
