Seiferlein, Ronald C., of Alger, Michigan formerly of Saginaw, beloved husband, father, and grandfather passed away at home on Monday, November 7, 2011. Age 69 years. Ronald Carl Seiferlein was born on March 16, 1942, in Saginaw to the late Otto and Elayne (Graebner) Seiferlein. He married Karen A. Nelson on December 7, 1963. She survives him. He was employed by GM at the Chevrolet Grey Iron Foundry in Saginaw, retiring in 2001 after 44 years of service. He served in the US Army from 1960-1963, during the Cuban Missile Crisis and served on the Honor Guard when President Kennedy made a trip to Germany in 1963. Ronald was a very avid deer hunter and enjoyed Walleye fishing. During winters, his wife got him to go to Arizona where they enjoyed family and Women's ASU college basketball and softball games, and the beautiful weather.
