Kabobel, Mr. Ronn F., of Saginaw, Michigan, passed away Tuesday, March 1, 2011, at St. Mary's of Michigan Medical Center. Age 73 years. Ronald Frederick Kabobel was born on December 6, 1937, in Saginaw, to Gotto F. and Ella (Becker) Kabobel. He married Shirley May Redburn on February 1, 1958, in Saginaw. She predeceased him on March 1, 2006. Ronn was a local real estate broker. He owned and operated Ronn Kabobel Realty for many years. He was a faithful and active member of Resurrection Lutheran Church, having served on many boards. Surviving are his two children, Kristine Kabobel, Saginaw; Aaron Kabobel, St. Clair Shores, Mich.; three grandchildren, Brooke (Russell) Purkiss, Joseph Spahr, and Ronald Spahr; two great-grandchildren, Taylor Purkiss and Waylon Purkiss; his mother, Ella Kabobel, Saginaw; one brother-in-law and two sisters-in-law, Gerald Redburn, Janice (Lee) Perkins and Carol (Roy) Moe; many nieces and nephews; also a special friend, Joanna Jones. He was predeceased by his son, Ronald F. Kabobel, Jr., his daughter, Kimberley Gaffney, and his father, Gotto F. Kabobel.
