A former resident of Saginaw, Michigan, Shirley passed away peacefully on Thursday, February 11, 2021, of congestive heart failure while under the care of Longmont United Hospital (TRU Hospice) in Longmont, Colorado. Shirley was 94 years old. She was born on September 2, 1926, in Saginaw, Michigan, to the late Guy and Helen (Siller) Brassaw. She was married to Edward C. Schleimer on December 22, 1951. Ed predeceased her on November 25, 1975. Shirley worked 50 years in public accounting. She started out of high school working 10 years for Wager, Lunt, & Oehring, CPA's.
