



## Mr. Steven Krupnek

November 29, 1920 - November 13, 2010

Krupnek, Mr. Steven, of Saginaw Twp., Michigan. Passed away on Saturday, November 13, 2010. Age 89 years. Steven Krupnek Jr. was born on November 29, 1920, in Fairgrove, MI, to the late Steven Krupnek Sr. and Mary (Mutter) Krupnek. He married Florence E. C. Frank on September 19, 1942, in Saginaw, where she survives him after 68 years of marriage. Mr. Krupnek was inducted into the U. S. Army during WWII. Cpl Steven Krupnek, Jr. was awarded 3 Bronze Stars for his bravery and service in three campaigns, including Normandy, Northern France and Rhineland. He was honorably discharged on November 20, 1945. Steven was a member of St. Mark Lutheran Church, where he had served as a trustee, and the American Legion Post #439. Prior to his retirement, Steven was employed as an installer for A. T. Frank for 26 years. Surviving besides his wife, Florence, are their children, Gerald (Joann) Krupnek, Saginaw; Carolyn (Thomas) Amond, Greenville, S.C.; Tom Krupnek and Maureen Sullivan, Saginaw; Richard (Patti) Krupnek, Hillman; nine grandchildren; 11 great-grandchildren; also several nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by three sisters and two brothers.

Funeral and committal services will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, November 18, 2010 at St. Mark Lutheran Church, 2565 N. Miller Rd., in Thomas Twp. The Rev. Edward Meyer will officiate. Friends are welcome to visit with the family at the church on Thursday from 10:00 a.m. until the time of services.
